In response to the last meeting minutes, Mr. Cluff said that the status is still the same....no equestrian allowed.

2020 PLANS

The restrooms are installed at the Pond Park and the cemetery, but probably haven't been unlocked for the year.

Justin asked if there will be boweries at Heritage Park where the pads are. Mr. Cluff said the pads are available, but he's not sure if boweries are planned.

Meadows – Mr. Cluff said that the grant from the State has been approved and we should have the money this spring. The present tennis court will be torn down and the pickle ball courts installed, as well as other improvements at the park. Barbara said that she has a friend from Roy who is willing to help get the pickle ball activities started when the courts are set up. Mr. Cluff also said that there will be handicap access.

Volunteers Day – Barbara checked with Karen Peterson and there will be a Volunteer Day in June.

Mr. Cluff said there are various improvements planned for the parks. He said the new 1300 North park is in the planning stage and he's working on a grant for it. Impact fees can also be used for this park. Other improvements will be the east end of Pond Park; Kestrel needs more improvements; Veteran's will be getting new picnic tables and the benches around the brick wall memorial should be in now. He said that there are more brick orders coming in so they will be starting to install them on the back side of the existing walls. The concrete walk will be extended around to the back, along with a bench.

Heritage Days will be July 8-11. Discussion was held regarding when to set up the Parks booth. It was suggested that we set up around 2:30 PM on Saturday, instead of early morning. Barbara will check with the Heritage Days committee regarding when vendors will be setting up, etc. and report back at our next meeting.

Fire Station Open House will be October 1st or 8th.

Jason reported that the locks on the disc golf basket nearest 2300 North were cut around Christmas time. He said he fixed them and notified Zac. Mr. Cluff said he would have Zac keep checking them. Jason said he's like to see some added sleeves installed so the baskets could be changed around, like they do on golf courses. Mr. Cluff said that they have had this conversation in-house and it's probably not possible. In regards to the drainage problem at the practice basket, Jason said it was probably due to over-watering this summer. Discussion was held suggesting setting up a disc golf tourney, around Halloween, with glow-in-the-dark equipment. Jason said he would talk to the Recreation Department about this.

MISCELLANEOUS & NEWLETTER

Justin suggested that we set up newsletter items every quarter so we know what's going in for three months at a time. February – reminder about garden plots; March – reminder to reserve boweries in the parks that have those facilities; April – point out the new bathrooms at Pond Park and the cemetery.

Barbara made the Board aware that money had been approved by the City Council for columbariums for the cemetery. Zac will be presenting a design and proposal for the City Council soon.
