As part of Fire Prevention Month, the Clinton City Fire Department would like to advise you of the Fire Safety Rules to escape a fire in the home.

OPERATION EDITH stands for Exit Drill In the Home.

ESCAPE RULES

- Keep calm, when in doubt don't panic.
- If you smell smoke, arouse the family with an emergency signal
- Close doors against smoke and heat.
- If the door is closed, test it before you open it by feeling near the top, if the door is hot, use your emergency exit.
- If your room is filled with smoke, keep down close to the floor where you can breath more easily
- Never re-enter a burning building.
- Assemble at a predetermined meeting place outside and then notify the fire department from a neighbor's home.

Also, please remember to have your furnaces checked to make sure they will function properly in the cold months to come.

ROUNDOABOUT ETIQUETTE

"A roundabout brings together conflicting traffic streams, allows the streams to safely merge and traverse the roundabout, and exit the streams to their desired directions. The geometric elements of the roundabout provide guidance to drivers approaching, entering, and traveling through a roundabout."

"Drivers approaching a roundabout must slow to a speed that will allow them to safely interact with other users of the roundabout, and to negotiate the roundabout." (*The roundabout at the intersection of 2300 N 1500 W is designed to be negotiated at 20 MPH*) The width of the approach roadway, the curvature of the roadway, and the volume of traffic present on the approach govern this speed. As drivers approach the yield line, they must check for conflicting vehicles already on the circulating roadway and determine when it is safe and prudent to enter the circulating stream (*conflicting traffic comes from the left*). The widths of the approach roadway and entry determine the number of vehicle streams that may form side by side at the yield line and govern the rate at which vehicles may enter the circulating roadway. (*The approaches to the roundabout are designed for single lane traffic*). The size of the inscribed circle affects the radius of the driver's path, which in turn determines the speed at which drivers travel on the roundabout. (*The asphalt circle, not the concrete over-run is the travel lane in the roundabout.*) The width of the circulatory roadway determines the number of vehicles that may travel side by side on the roundabout. (*This roundabout is designed for single lane traffic*).

There are not many roundabouts in Utah; however, the number is increasing and will continue to increase as the functionality of them is more greatly understood. For more information go to www.tfrc.gov/safety/00068.htm.
