A MESSAGE FROM THE FIRE DEPARTMENT

Fireworks Restrictions

Clinton City **does not** have any Firework Restrictions in place at this time. However, in a proactive approach to preventing fires, we ask the public to exercise good firework safety practices and common sense. Use extra caution around open fields and the walking trail due to the high fuel levels and the decreasing fuel moisture content.

Firework safety tips:

- Purchase fireworks from reliable, licensed fireworks dealers. Read all instructions to reduce the chances of a destructive fire or debilitating injury.
- Follow all safety guidelines exactly. Children should not handle fireworks. You must be at least 16 years of age to handle or light fireworks. Adults are to supervise any activity that includes fireworks.
- Never let children handle, play with or light fireworks. Only knowledgeable and clear-headed adults should handle fireworks.
- Adults should never use alcohol or drugs or be impaired while engaged in handling, using, placing or lighting fireworks.
- Aerial devices need at least 30 foot clearance around on the ground and as much as 150 feet in the air.
- Never shoot fireworks in windy conditions.
- Keep a bucket of water or running hose nearby during the time of lighting and disposing of fireworks and in case of an emergency.
- Use caution with animals. Excitement, noise and lights can cause fear and stress.

Please remember State Law allows the discharge of fireworks 3 days before and 3 days after the 4th and 24th of July between the hours of 11 a.m. and 11 p.m. except on July 4th and July 24th the hours are 11 a.m. to Midnight. You can also discharge fireworks on New Year's Eve and Chinese New Year between the hours of 11 a.m. and 1 a.m.

SUMMER GRILLING SAFETY TIPS

Learning about grilling safety can make your summer barbecue a fun day for everyone! The [U.S. Fire Administration](http://www.usfa.gov) (USFA) recommends the following tips for preventing burns and controlling the flames while you grill outside:

- Only use your grill outside. Keep it away from siding and decks.
- Wear short sleeves or roll them up when cooking on the grill.
- Open your gas grill before lighting.
- Use long-handled barbecue tools.
- Keep a three-foot safe zone around grills, fire pits, and campfires. This will help keep kids and pets safe.
- Never leave your grill, fire pit, or patio torches unattended.
- Clean your grill after each use. This will remove grease that can start a fire.
- Place the coals from your grill in a metal can with a lid once they have cooled.

- 1300 N beginning at 3100 West and continuing through West Point to approximately 3600 W;
- 2300 N from 2200 West to 2500 West;
- 1300 N from 1800 West to 1500 West
- Resurfacing the 1500 West 2300 North roundabout.

The majority of these projects include replacing the water line prior to beginning the asphalt work.

We have lived in Clinton since 1971. My wife Arcelia (Arcy) was born in Chama, New Mexico. We have been married for 52 years. We have three children: Tino lives in Roy, Antionette lives in Hooper and Jimmy lives in South Weber. We have 11 Grandchildren, 3 Great Grandchildren and one on the way.

I was born in Saguache, Colorado in 1937. I am the oldest of 6 siblings 2 sisters and 4 brothers. My mother went to Heaven when I was 8 years old. We survived with the help of God, Grandparents, friends and neighbors from Saguache who all contributed to help my Father.

We all attended school; it was my father's wish that we would all graduate. It was hard having only one parent but, we all graduated from Saguache High School.

After graduation we moved to Utah in search of work, because in Saguache there was none unless you wanted to be a rancher or shepherd. As a teenager I worked as a shepherd until I graduated from High School. When we moved to Utah I immediately found work in construction as a laborer. After a few months I was given the opportunity to become a heavy equipment operator which paid more money. After working construction for two years, in October 1960 Uncle Sam sent me a Greeting Card to report to the Military. I was active duty for 3 years. I spent most of my military in the Far East countries of Thailand, Okinawa and Hawaii then came home and was discharged from the military. I joined the Army Reserves and retired after 26 years of service.

I began working for the Federal Government at Hill Air Force Base in June 1966. I worked for 31 years and retired. I also attended college while working and graduated with a Degree in Tax Accounting and Business Management. Arcelia (Arcy) also retired from Civil Service. She worked for the IRS for 17 years and 31 years at Hill Air Force Base for a total of 48 years.

While working at Hill Air Force Base, we both volunteered 2 hours per week to help with the Star Education Program sponsored by the Air Force at an Elementary in Ogden, which we enjoyed. I also became a member of the Sunset Jaycees, an organization that did community work for the city. This was the beginning of my volunteering for the community. I joined Image de Utah a Hispanic Organization and helped for 15 years including 5 years as State President, this was a lot of work but rewarding. I attended meetings with state and Federal Government Officials and different local organizations throughout the State concerning discrimination and employment issues.

I have been a volunteer for 43 years for the IRS Vita Tax and AARP Tax-Aide Program to prepare taxes for the low income taxpayers and Senior Citizens for FREE. I was responsible for 10 sites and 45 volunteers for the Northern Utah AARP Tax-Aide tax preparation program for Senior Citizens. I really enjoy preparing taxes for Senior Citizens; it is very rewarding to know you are helping the community.

In July 1999 I was approached by the Census Bureau to do the Census 2000 which I accepted for two years. In 2002 I was elected to the Clinton City Council for two years. I was the Clinton City Recreation Director from 1976-1978.

I currently serve on the Board of Zoning Adjustments, Citizens on Patrol and I am a crossing guard for Clinton City Schools.

We are proud to live in Clinton City. We have enjoyed watching it grow from a farming community to a big city.
