IMPORTANT INFORMATION.....

Sewer Treatment Plant Fee Increase

The North Davis Sewer District treats the sewage from Clinton and surrounding cities. The major portion of your monthly City Sewer Fee goes to pay for this treatment. The Sewer District is increasing their fee by \$1.20 per month per residence. This fee increase will be passed on to all City residents beginning July 2009. Your City fee will go from \$9.50/month to \$10.70/month to cover this cost.

Secondary Water Rate Increase

The City collects the secondary water payments for the Davis and Weber Counties Canal Company. The Canal Company is increasing their monthly fee for the basic residential home by \$1.04 per month effective July 2009. The Canal Company advises that their new reservoir located in West Point City is coming on line this season. This increase in water volume and water pressure into the delivery system we share with West Point is anticipated to increase and stabilize the secondary water pressure throughout Clinton.

Municipal Elections

Up coming election information can be found on the Clinton City web site at www.clintoncity.net. Three Council seats are up for election, the Mayor and two City Council seats, all 4-year terms. Persons wishing to be a candidate must:

- Be a registered voter;
- Have resided within Clinton City for the 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the November election date; and,
- Not have been convicted of treason or a felony and lost the right to vote.

A city resident may become a candidate for the Mayor or City Council seat by either:

- Declaring Candidacy with the City Manager (signing the form) and paying a \$25.00 fee; or, Obtaining a Nomination Petition from the City Manager's office and getting 25 or more qualified signatures (Clinton residents 18 yrs of age or older)-No Fee.

Petitions or declarations for candidacy can only be filed with the City Manager from **July 1st to July 15th**, as set by State Code. All petitions or declarations must be correctly completed and returned to the City before 5:00 P.M. on July 15, 2009.

PLEASE COMPLY

- The City has received several complaints concerning residents dumping grass clippings and other yard debris over their fences onto adjoining agricultural property.
- Individuals doing this may be charged with illegal dumping or found responsible if irrigation canals overflow and flood a house or a farmer's field resulting in crop failure.
- If you need more garbage can space for clippings, additional garbage cans are available at a cost of \$9.50 per month. Contact the utilities department at 801-614-0700 to request another can. In addition, tree branches up to 8' in diameter are accepted at Public Works 1711 W. 1700 N. on Mondays and Thursdays from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m.
- There have also been complaints about litter on the Rail Trail on 1000 W between 800 N and 1300 N. Residents who have been feeding stray cats in the area have contributed to the problem. Please do not feed the cats and contact Animal Control at 801-444-2200.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

This summer, UDOT will widen or re-stripe 2000 W (SR-108), where needed, to create a three-lane roadway (one traveling lane in each direction with a center turn lane) between Antelope Drive (1700 south) in Syracuse and 1900 West in West Haven. This will provide immediate congestion relief and improve safety along the entire corridor. Construction is planned to begin in July 2009. No work is anticipated between 1300 N and 2300 N in Clinton. There will be an open house June 9, 2009, 4:30 p.m. – 7:00 p.m., at Syracuse Elementary School, 1503 S 2000 W, to explain the project to the public.
