Fire Chief Olsen would like to caution residents to please be mindful of the potential hazards associated with cooking this holiday season.

- Cooking equipment is the leading cause of home structure fires.
- Unattended cooking is the leading contributing factor.
- More than half of reported non-fatal home cooking fire injuries occur when victims try to fight the fire themselves.
- Electric ranges or cooktops have a higher risk of fire than gas.
- Thanksgiving is the peak day for home cooking fires followed by Christmas Day which is followed by Christmas Eve.

ROAD CONSTRUCTION

1600 WEST – 1590 NORTH TO 1740 NORTH

The City will be starting a major storm drain and land drain construction project on 1600 West from 1590 North to 1740 North during the month of November. The project is expected to last up to two months and will be constructing a new storm drain and land drain line. This phase of the construction will be on the east side of 1600 W and will remove the curb and east edge of the roadway. At the conclusion of this phase there will not be asphalt placed on the trench site in order to allow for trench to settle. There will be periods of time with limited access to driveways and 1620 & 1680 N along with 1590 and 1740 N. Once construction begins, please avoid the area when possible, observe all flaggers and traffic caution signs, and as always instruct your children to stay out of construction areas. We know that this will be an inconvenience; however these improvements are greatly needed in the area.

Water is the most important storage item. It is suggested to have 1 gallon per person per day available. Store foods that your family can easily prepare and will eat.
